HOLIDAYS/CELEBRATIONS

Celebrations can be wonderful opportunities for children to learn about the traditions and values that are cherished parts of people's lives. Many parents, too, wonder why programs celebrate specific holidays or why they discourage any celebration at all. The important thing for all to remember is that when planning holiday activities and/or celebrations, the rules of good practice continue to apply: **Are the activities meaningful to the children? Are their needs and interests being met? Is the activity a valuable use of children's time?**

- Activities demonstrate the fact that not everyone in the same ethnic group celebrates holidays in the same way. Families may provide examples of their own unique traditions.
- Curriculum demonstrates respect for everyone's customs. If children are observing different holidays at the same time, the values and traditions of each child's culture should be acknowledged.

NEW SKILL DEVELOPMENT FOR 3-5 YEAR-OLDS

Who doesn't want a child that can self-regulate during challenging situations? Children don't just magically develop this skillset, they need to be taught. Your CYPs are ready to do just that—with your help, of course!

Both the CDCs and YC will be helping children develop the important skill set of RESPONDING instead of REACTING using the Sesame Street Game— Breathe, Think, Do.
